


Project problems:



- It is possible to catch other infectious diseases




Piercing – a form of body modification, is the practice of puncturing or cutting a part of the human body, creating an opening in which jewellery may be worn.

Piercing history Lip piercing




Danger of piercing :

The results of survey teenagers from 7,9 Forms (12 pupils)




What do you think about tattoo and piercing?




What is more popular-tattoo or piercing?
